The Board of Equalization of Madison County, Nebraska met at 9:00 A.M.

Advance notice of meeting was published in the Thursday, November 6, 2008 edition of The Norfolk Daily News. A copy of said notice was mailed to each Board member. An affidavit of acknowledgment of receipt of notice of meeting as published was executed. Chairman Rick Uhlir called the meeting to order and notified the public of the location of the information regarding the Open Meeting Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Jerry McCallum, Rick Uhlir, and Lee Klein, County Assessor Jeff Hackerott, County Treasurer Donna Primrose, and County Clerk Nancy Scheer.

Motion was made by Klein and seconded by McCallum to approve the agenda for the meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Chairman Jerry McCallum called the meeting to order and notified the public of the location of the information regarding the Open Meeting Act posted in the meeting room.

Pursuant to published legal notice in the Saturday, November 1, 2008 edition of the Norfolk Daily News, Chairman McCallum opened a public hearing at 10:03 A.M. to receive citizens' comments regarding a proposed amendment to the Madison County Zoning and Subdivision Regulations to raise the minimum number of head equivalent from 300 to 500 before a conditional use permit is required in the AG1 zoning district.

Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson reported that this proposed amendment was prepared by the Planning Commission. He explained that the current zoning regulations apply to AG1 and AG2 and the proposed amendment limits the regulations to AG1, which is the agricultural land located south of the Elkhorn River. He stated that the amendment would apply to existing livestock operations; therefore, the amendment defines that it would apply to operations in existence as of July 1, 2008. He explained that 500 head equivalent is 500 head of feeder cattle, 1,250 head of finishing pigs, or 350 head of dairy cows.

Commissioner Klein questioned why the boundary of the Elkhorn River was chosen. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson responded that the agricultural land north of the Elkhorn River is AG2, primarily because it is more environmentally sensitive due to the amount of sandy soil.

Dave Uecker explained that his land is located north of the Elkhorn River, so he questioned if the proposed amendment would apply to his property. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson responded that this proposed amendment would not apply to land zoned as AG2. He stated that Mr. Uecker could submit an application to have his property re-zoned from AG2 to AG1. Mr. Uecker explained that it is impossible to exist with a feeder cattle operation of 300 head or even 500 head. He stated that the regulations should be at a level that makes sense for the current times. He stated that 500 head of feeder cattle would not generate substantial income to sustain an operation. He reported that if the county wants operators to feed cattle there are some measures that can be taken, such as installing sediment traps and filter strips. Mr. Uecker explained that if the property is zoned properly a lagoon is not required for 1,000 head of feeder cattle. He stated that he is glad that the County Board is considering raising the limit by 200 head; however, he questioned if the county would consider raising the number of livestock by

an additional 200 head if the current operation is permitted for 500 or 800 head of cattle. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson responded that the proposed amendment would allow an existing operator that has 300 or less animal units to increase to a maximum of 500 head in the AG1 zoning district. Mr. Uecker explained that he currently has a permit for 800 head of feeder cattle and he questioned if he could increase his livestock numbers by an additional 200 head.

Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson explained that Mr. Uecker could submit an application to increase the number of livestock on his property. He explained that the proposed amendment increases the number of animal units that could be located on a parcel before a conditional use permit is required and it would allow current operators to expand their existing operations without submitting an amended application. He explained that the DEQ regulations consider 300 or less head equivalent as small operations and 301 to 999 head equivalent are medium operations. Mr. Johnson reported that if the operation is close to a creek or has a direct connection to a water stream the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) could implement additional regulations. In addition, he explained that as a general rule, unless there is some type of environmental threat, an operator could usually establish up to 1,000 animal units before DEQ would get involved. He reported that Pierce County has established regulations limiting the maximum number of animal units to 1,000 before a conditional use permit is required.

Dave Uecker reported that some ground in Pierce County is sandier than the property where he has his livestock operation. He requested the County Board to consider establishing the proposed amendment countywide. He stated that if an operator wants to expand, the county should approve it because he is in favor of economic development.

Chairman McCallum stated that the county is not regulating the number of livestock with this proposed amendment, but are increasing the number of livestock that an operator can have before a conditional use permit is required. He explained that when the animal units exceed 500 head there is an additional accumulation of manure and there must be a place to spread the manure. He stated that the DEQ also governs the total number of cattle located on certain properties. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson explained that the setback requirements are the same for 300 and 500 head of livestock.

Dave Uecker reported that the regulations in Holt and Pierce Counties have a minimum number of 1,000 animal units before a conditional use permit is required. He stated that he is pleased that the county is considering increasing the number to 500 animal units; however, he would like the minimum increased to 1,000 head. He stated that the County Board would make a statement for promoting the agricultural sector if the minimum number was increased to 1,000 animal units.

Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson provided a history of the proposed amendment by explaining that the original proposal was an increase from 300 to 500 animal units with no other stipulations. He reported that the Planning Commission considered this proposal at a hearing immediately following the Mike Henn dairy expansion hearing, so some of the people who testified at the Henn Dairy hearing also testified at the hearing for this proposed amendment. He stated that the Planning Commission tabled the proposal after the initial hearing and the only person who appeared at the next meeting was Roy Swoboda, who presented video footage regarding the amendment, which may have influenced the decision of the Planning Commission.

Dave Uecker stated that with the current economics and the cost of running a livestock operation, the County Board should consider increasing the minimum number of animal units higher than 500 head.

No testimony was received in opposition to the proposed amendment. Chairman McCallum closed the public hearing at 10:18 A.M.

After discussion, the following resolution was introduced:

RESOLUTION #2008-72

A RESOLUTION AMENDING BY REFERENCE CERTAIN LANGUAGE IN THE MADISON COUNTY ZONING AND SUBDIVISION RESOLUTIONS UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED BY SECTIONS 23-114.01 THROUGH 223-114.05 AND 23-165 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF NEBRASKA, 1943.

WHEREAS, having received a recommendation for approval from the Madison County Joint Planning Commission and proper notice been given and public hearing held as provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska, hereby amends the Madison County Zoning and Subdivision Resolution by amending the following language into Article Two sub-section 202 and Article Four, Sub-sections 402, 403 and 404. New additional language is shown in *italics* and passages removed are shown as ~~stricken~~ as described in detail below.

202: Definition of Terms

F

1. Farming: The planting, cultivating, harvesting and storage of grains, hay or plants commonly grown in Nebraska with the necessary accessory uses for treating or storing the produce and the feeding of livestock as prescribed hereunder, provided such accessory uses do not include the feeding of garbage or offal to swine or other animals. In contrast to a Animal Feeding Operation (AFO), as hereinafter defined, any person or entity operating within the following categories shall be considered to be a farming operation and shall not be considered as operating a AFO unless the operation exceeds the following:

- a. Two (2) Head Equivalent (HE) as defined in the definition for Animal Feeding Operation herein, for the first acre and an overall density of One (1) HE per acre for a parcel less than forty (40) acres in size;
- b. One (1) HE per acre for a parcel of land greater than forty (40) acres, but less than eighty (80) acres; or
- c. Two (2) HE per acre for parcels over eighty (80) acres.
- d. Exception: When a temporary permit is issued for animals used strictly for educational purposes in conjunction with a non-profit sponsor, school district or other political subdivision to a maximum of four (4) HE. Said Temporary Permit shall be valid for a period of twelve (12) months and is validated by the program sponsor/instructor.

Notwithstanding the provisions of A-C above, anytime the number or combination of Head Equivalent (HE) exceeds three hundred (300), regardless of the size of the parcel of land, and where the confined area is for more than forty-five consecutive days in an area not used to grow crops or considered pasture, the operation shall be considered a AFO and the owner/operator shall be required to obtain a Conditional Use Permit, in these Regulations. *Except a livestock producer located in AG-1 and operating prior to July 1, 2008 may have up to 500 head equivalent in confinement on a minimum of one quarter of land without a Conditional Use Permit unless required by Nebraska State Statute.*

402: AG1 Intensive Agriculture

Permitted Principal Uses

The following principal uses are permitted in the AG1 Intensive Agriculture District.

1. Agricultural operations, and the usual agricultural and farm buildings and structures, including the residences of the owners and their families and any tenants and employees who are engaged in agricultural operations on the premises.
- d. Small animal feeding operations and small confined animal feeding operations. *Except a livestock producer located in AG-1 and operating prior to July 1, 2008 may have up to 500 head equivalent in confinement on a minimum of one quarter of land without a Conditional Use Permit unless required by Nebraska State Statute.*

A duly advertised hearing has been held by the Madison County Joint Planning Commission and the Madison County Board of Commissioners after a recommendation for approval by the said Joint Planning Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect and be in force no sooner than the 12th day of November, 2008.

Motion was made by Klein and seconded by Uhlir that the foregoing resolution be adopted. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

County Attorney Joseph Smith discussed the claim payable to Flinn Paving Company in the amount of \$103,732.23 for asphalt overlay on the Broken Bridge Road for Road District #2. He stated that the claim was not appropriate under the competitive bidding laws and the county made an innocent mistake. He stated that the work has been completed and it would not be appropriate to disallow payment to the company that completed the work. He stated that when something like this happens, it can't be reversed; therefore, he recommended that the County Board approve payment to Flinn Paving Company. He stated that he would give presentation on public bidding at a future Board meeting.

No further action was taken.
